This list of order sets will eventually include the entire catalog available at Overlake. We are making them available in PDF format as a convenience to our providers until our fully electronic health record is available. You will note that in PDF format they cannot be altered – this is by design in order to preserve the integrity of the order set and make sure it integrates with our pharmacy processes. At this time we are placing them on the Website in order of most common to least, to meet the needs of you, our providers, as quickly as possible. Over the next several months, we hope to have them all accessible.

We have attempted to name them in a logical fashion to help in locating the desired order set. You will notice that several order sets have been listed with several different names to assist this process. Eventually we may place them in specialty-based folders and provide a search bar to also help in finding the desired document.

Please feel free to print them out as needed from both your office as well as from within Overlake. We want to discourage “printing ahead” as the versions often change and using an outdated order set can be problematic. Please restrict your use to one copy to be used only at the time of printing. Overlake attempts to keep each order set completely up to date in terms of best practices and to use them to help its providers meet the highest quality standards of practice.
